IHP Resolution n. XXIII-5

Approved by the UNESCO-IHP Intergovernmental Council (15/6/2018)

«The Global Network of Water Museums and UNESCO-IHP in support of water sustainability education and water awareness efforts»









Resolution submitted by the Netherlands

Supported by 14 countries (out of 36 with right to vote): Canada, Italy, Greece, Ecuador, Mexico, Cuba, Argentina, Uruguay, Senegal, Ghana, Nigeria, Iran...











IHP Resolution n. XXIII-5 **JUNE 2018**

The Global Network is "established, for a period of 4 years renewable, based on its performance, as 'an IHP initiative' to create synergies with UNESCO with the aim of better using water heritage to improve water management via communication and educational activities"

- Non-profit NGO registered in Venice (May 8^{th)}
- Rules in line with EU legislation for non-profit

CHARTER of WAMU-NET

Rules for nomination of governing bodies:
 President, Vice-Presidents, Executive Director,
 Advisory Board, WGs...





2 PHASES

Phase 1: June 2018 - May 2019

 Transitional phase managed by the founding members (Civiltà dell'Acqua, Kring Vrienden, etc 11 members of the MB) in order to register the Charter

Phase 2: June 2019 – May 2019

 The Charter sets a number of rules in line with Italian legislation for non-profit NGO (President, Budget...)





BASIC RULES: WAMU-NET CHARTER

- Art. 3 = the Plenary Assembly of all members is the highest authority: it delegates to a number of internal Bodies its functions (and set rules to clarify relations among bodies...)
- Art. 3 = "Formal members" are those in line with Annual contributions
- Democratic Rule: 1 member = 1 vote
- Thursday 13: official signature of the Charter with Tribunal of Waters and all Members
- Art. 1 = Regional Centres





3 MAIN CATEGORIES FOR MEMBERSHIPS

- 1. Museums (criteria in the Charter)
- 1. Associated members (including Municipalities, Provinces, Universities, Research Centres, Water Agencies....)
- 3. Affiliated members (entities non-legally registered, NGOs, individual partners)




