The first guided tour in 1867

The first tour of the sewers was in 1867 during the Universal Exhibition.

Visit by train or by small boat

The first sewers' visits were only for privileged people and it was first done by train, and then by small boat.

A real museum in 1975 with a first renovation in 1990

Since 1975, everybody can visit sewers by walking in the sewer parts near the Alma bridge.











The objectives of the project


- A new visibility: visibility in the city and on the internet

- **Communication and teaching:** a discovery for school, families, Parisians or tourists






The challenges


- **Sharing the history** of the sewers and water about the city of Paris

The future virtual representation of sewers in 3D




The architectural and scenography choice
