After the heavy shock of a global-scale lockdown due to the COVID-19, the 4th International Conference of the Global Network originally planned in Hangzhou (March 2020) had to be canceled. The present pandemic is causing all over the world **severe impacts on water museums, which must look for new strategies to engage visitors both virtually and non-virtually**.

The 1st International Webinar of the Global Network of Water Museums (WAMU-NET), hosted by the National Water Museum of China, is held to focus on adaptations made by water museums to face the COVID-19 through either virtual or concrete activities. The title, "**Embracing Changes**", aims at presenting and discussing with a positive mindset **the most effective strategies adopted by water museums to face the pandemic**.

Members of the Global Network will be invited to participate in two Sessions and two Round Table discussions to share their experiences on how they implemented **new virtual and digital strategies to carry out education**, **exhibition and research activities during the lockdown**, in order to engage their audiences in new ways and to encourage people re-evaluating water heritage while fighting against the virus.

During the webinar, the official launch of the 2^{nd} Edition of the youth contest and award "The Water We Want" will be made.

Finally, a **Manifesto** will be launched to proclaim WAMU-NET's interests and commitment to strengthen our partnership and build new solidarity and cooperation on the use of digital tools, develop new project ideas, training
