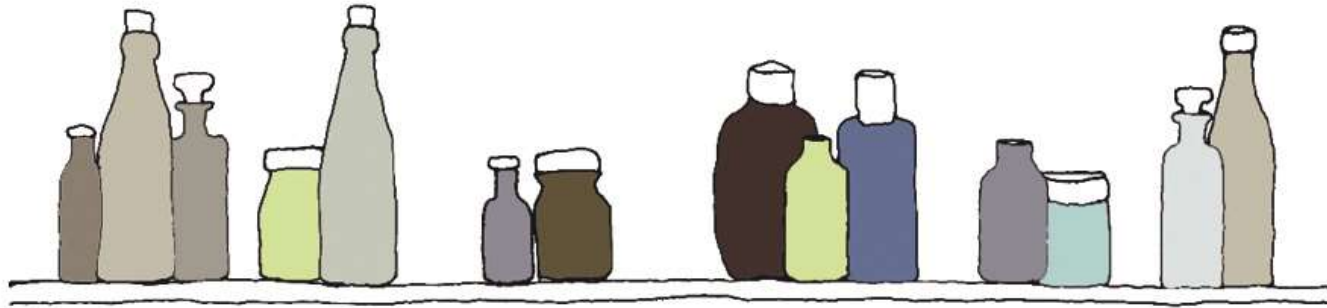

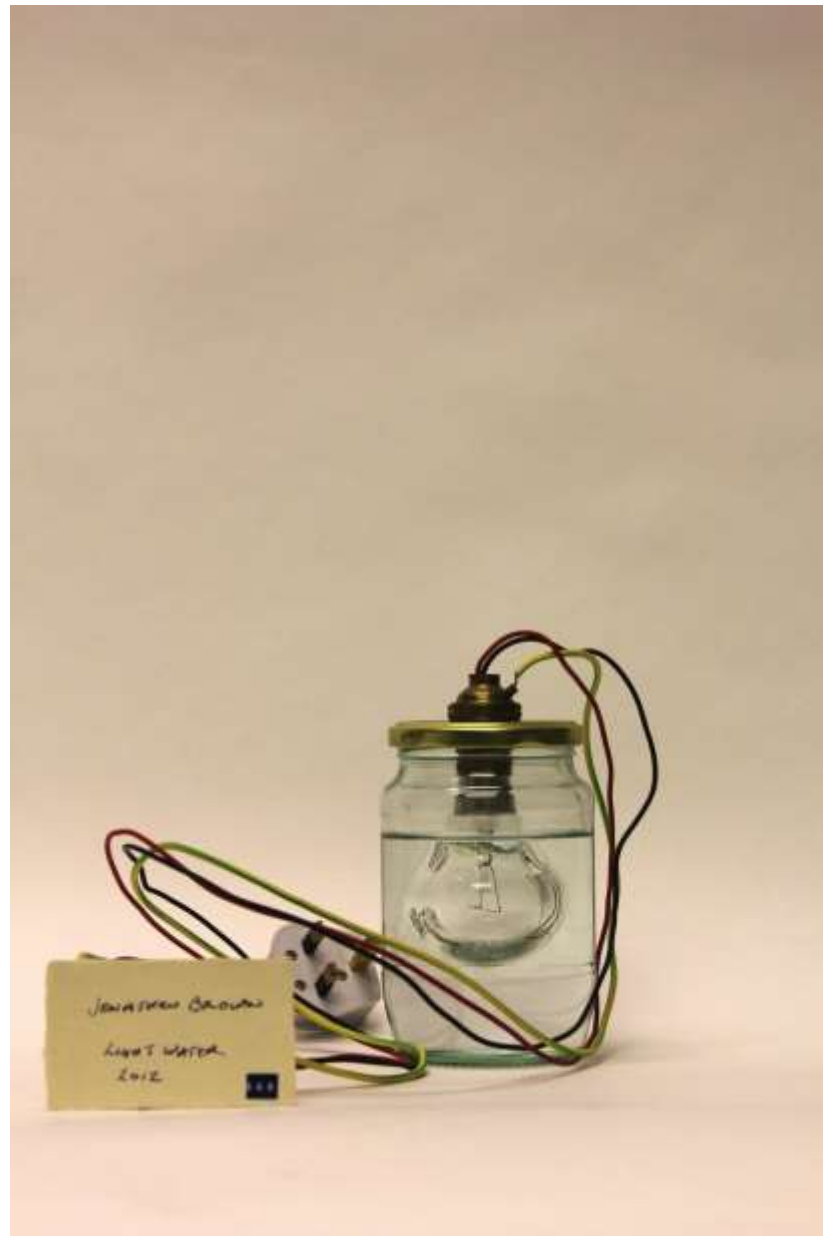

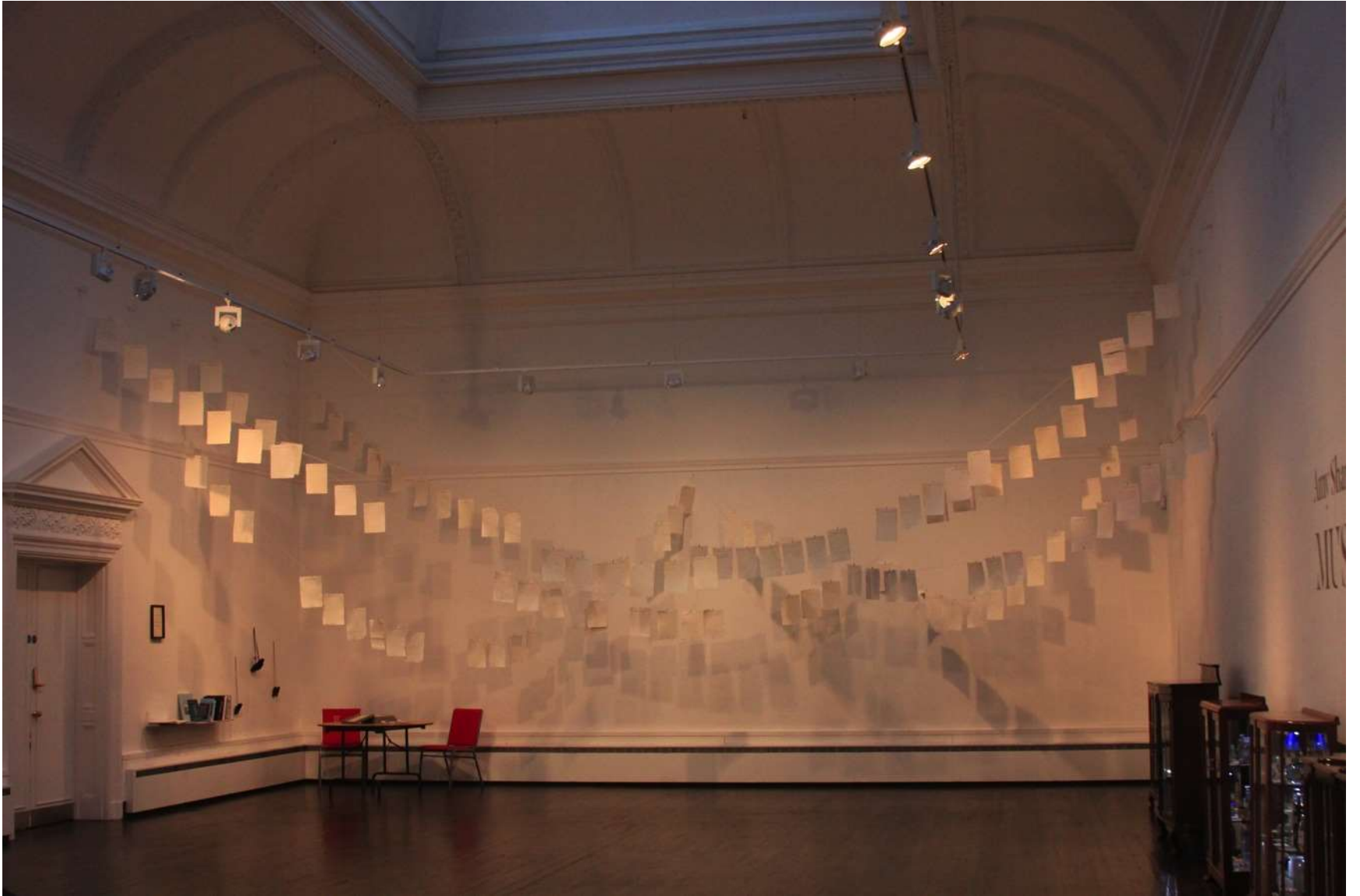

I would have brought the water from the river on the day I chose life, life and courage and everybody who I love.



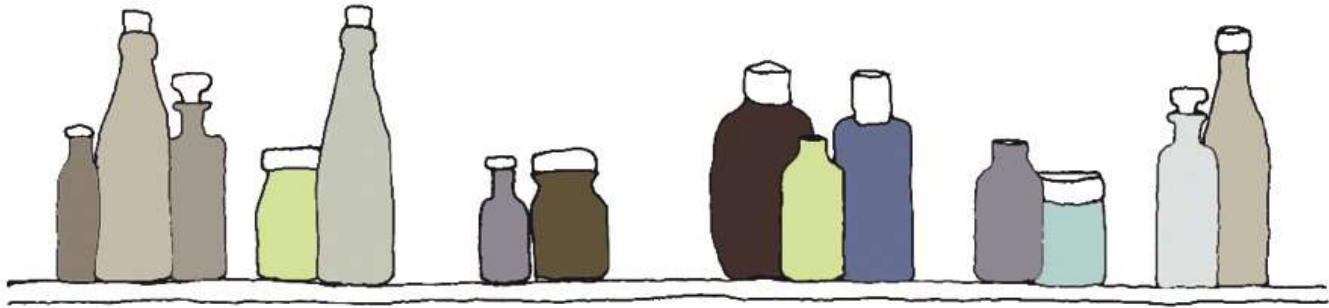
