1. Opening of the meeting and appointment of the Chair

The President Eddy Moors is present and opens the General Assembly at 1.30 pm CET. The President welcomes all participants and congratulates on all museums that are open and active despite the severe restrictions due to COVID.

2. Approval of the Record of last General Assembly

The record of the previous meeting of the General Assembly is read by the Executive Director, Eriberto Eulisse, and approved with the abstention of those members who were not present.

3. Presentation of the new video produced by HYDRIA in cooperation with WAMU-NET

A new video on "Water, Heritage and SDGs" with a focus on the Mediterranean water assets was commissioned by MIO-ECSDE/Hydria (GR) to WAMU-NET through European funds: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OY6f9iOtDos

This is the 3rd video produced by WAMU-NET (the first was commissioned by the IHP-HWRP National Committee of the Netherlands and the second by the National Water Museum of China, Hangzhou). Eddy Moors thanks the President of Hydria, prof. Scoullos, for considering WAMU-NET as an entity that could deliver activities to MIO-ECSDE within an EU funded project.



4. Welcome to new WAMU-NET Members

A power point illustrates the members that joined in the 2nd semester of 2021: four members from Italy (HYDRA / Multimedia Museum of the Marmore Waterfalls, Terni; Italian National Association of Land Reclamation / ANBI, Rome; National Archaeological Museum of Adria / City of Adria; and the Historic Well of San Patrizio / City of Orvieto); one member from Macedonia (Water Museum of Ohrid lake, Ohrid); one from Malta (GHAJN National Water Conservation Awareness Center, Rabat); and one from Mexico (Museo Interactivo del Agua IURHEKUA, Uruapan). All WAMU-NET members welcome the new partners.

5. Nomination of the external observer (mandate 2021-2023)

Mr. Abou Amani, Director of the Division of Water Sciences, and Secretary of the Intergovernmental Hydrological Program (UNESCO) is proposed to join the WAMUNET Board as an external observer. Members express appreciation for this availability and approve unanimously.

6. Nomination of new member of the Advisory Committee

A new member of Advisory Committee, prof. Jordì Morato Farreras (Polytechnical Univ. of Barcelona, and expert of ancestral Hydro-Technologies) is proposed to join as a member of the Advisory Committee. Is CV is read and all members agree.

7. I Remember Water – contributions of water museums to the World Exhibition

The ED Eriberto Eulisse recalls the Call for manifestation of interest addressed to WAMU-NET members aimed at contributing to the World Exhibition 'I Remember Water'. A curatorial team will select the most representative images sent by all participating institutions from around the world to create an exhibition 'in hand' - a taster of the different 'water worlds' exhibited by museums affiliated to WAMU-NET. This selection will be made available to illustrate the diversity and similarity of humankind's connections with water and its heritage.

Deadline for sending entries is set on 20 December 2021. Thanks to this new platform, it will be possible to organize more easily, whenever needed, travelling exhibitions worldwide involving all partners. A warm thank you is given to Sara Ahmed who provided funds to implement this new project through her Gold Membership.

8. Planned activities at the 9th World Water Forum, Dakar (March 2022)

On March 22nd, representatives from WAMU-NET will participate in the 9th World Water Forum in Dakar (Senegal). This year theme is 'Water Security for Peace and Development'. A thematic session will be organized by WAMU-NET in cooperation with IHP to disseminate the project of the World Inventory. The session aims at launching the World Inventory of water museums, ecomuseums, and extended museums worldwide. The session will involve leading African institutions to start mapping water museums as well as interpretation centers, community-based museums, water-related legacies, and cultural landscapes with the potential to create new and future water museums, and to stimulate discussion and cooperation around the implementation process.

9. The World Inventory of water museums and heritage sites

This initiative reflects the contents and objectives of UNESCO-IHP's Resolution n.7-XXIV titled "UNESCO-IHP in support of developing the Global Network of Water Museums" (2021). It provides the background to compile an inventory of water museums across the world and send a call to all National IHP Committees with a toolkit and a preliminary taxonomy to start the census. This project will be a chance also to reach those countries where there are not members yet.



10. 3rd edition of the Youth Contest and Award "The Water We Want"

The ED is pleased to announce that registrations are opened to join the 3rd edition of the Youth Contest 'The Water We Want'. A restyled website is finally available where all previous editions and digital exhibitions are hosted.

11. Online Training Course "Beyond Museums" organized by the Venice UNESCO Chair

Sara Luchetta illustrates the training opportunity offered to all water museums with free participation. So far most of webinars have been implemented successfully. 80 participants are registered and for each webinar there is an average of 50-60 participants among museum members, students and researchers.

12. Membership annual contributions – year 2021 (received until Nov. 30th)

A table illustrates all memberships paid by institutions and those that are still outstanding at Nov. 30th. The total amount of collected contributions are considered as usually to make the forecast budget of next year.

13. Annual Memberships – year 2022

It is proposed to keep the same amounts of previous years for 2022 membership fees. The ED suggests a few modifications for Gold, Silver and Ivory memberships, as illustrated in the <u>attachment n.1</u>. The annual memberships for 2022 are approved by all present members.

14. Forecast Budget for the year 2022 (art.16)

The draft forecast Budget for the year 2022 is outlined by the Executive Director and commented by Ian Kerr-Wilson. It is stressed that, even though the COVID has strongly accentuated the fragilities of the Network, the Gold Memberships will enable WAMU-NET to plan some of its institutional activities in 2022 with the lowest available revenues. There are wide margins to improve its range of activities and strengthen fundraising. All members approve the 2022 budget.

15. AOB – Proposals and suggestions from WAMU-NET Members

As there are no further issues suggested by members, the President thanks all participants for their active contributions and invites them to vote by the deadline of the Telematic meeting (when all final votes will be collected and counted).
